Discuss Seawater Desalination Plant Project SWIFT Project No 51089 Application Review Comments & District Response. C. Ortiz, with detail, presented the Board with the Seawater Desalination Plant Project Budget from the Texas Water Development Board for the SWIFT Application. The presentation gave details and clarification on Items for the Project. Construction – 5MGD 100% Seawater TWDB Funds SWIFT Low-Interest Loan \$5,415,000.00

4	Discuss Water System Improvements Opinions of Probable Construction Cost, Actual Contract Amounts, and Professional Services Agreement with Freese and Nichols, Inc. C. Ortiz noted that the Project for Water Plant No. 1 started in 2021 with the Opinion Probable Construction Cost (OPCC) of \$12.1 Million. As of June 2024, OPCC is \$21.1 Million. This increase is due to inflation and market conditions, which have significantly raised costs in the past 4 to 5 years, posing a budget challenge for the Project (copy attached of Water Plant Improvements Project Schedule). Freese and Nichols Project Manager Charles Kucherka gave a PowerPoint Presentation (copy attached) on the Contract for the Water System Improvements. The presentation exhibited the Original Contract from September 2021 with a breakdown summary of each itemized (four amendments) amendment, showing details and clarification for each project amendment. A fifth proposed amendment (tabled at the Regular Meeting on May 22) will be presented and considered for approval at the Regular Meeting on June 12. However, Mr. Kurcherka recommended no action and proposed revising Amendment No. 5 (copy attached) to only include Water Plant No. 1 Desalination Design Modifications. Amendment No. 6 (copy attached) will reconcile the extended project duration and additional coordination required for TWDB Funding. Both Amendments will be brought to the Board for approval at a future meeting.
